

ABASE

Meaning: To abase means to lower in rank, office, prestige, or esteem; to belittle or degrade someone or oneself.

1. To constantly abase others in order to feel superior is a sign of deep insecurity.
2. He felt that his job did little more than abase his talents and ambitions.
3. The leader's harsh words served only to abase the morale of the team.
4. She refused to abase herself by begging for forgiveness after the misunderstanding.
5. It is unwise to abase your own worth in front of those who do not appreciate you.
6. The teacher's comments were meant to motivate, but they only seemed to abase the students.
7. They feared that the new policy would abase their rights and freedoms.
8. To abase oneself for the approval of others is a path to unhappiness.
9. He found it hard to watch his friend abase himself just to gain acceptance from the group.
10. The documentary highlighted how societal pressures can abase individual creativity and expression.
