

ABASES

Meaning: ABASES (verb): to lower in rank, office, prestige, or esteem; to belittle or degrade someone's self-worth or confidence.

1. His constant criticism abases her confidence in her abilities.
2. The harsh feedback from his mentor abases his enthusiasm for the project.
3. She felt that his remarks about her appearance abases her dignity in front of others.
4. To ridicule someone in public abases their sense of self-worth.
5. The teacher's approach to discipline sometimes abases students instead of encouraging them.
6. He realized that his words could easily abases someone who is already feeling vulnerable.
7. Using sarcasm in a serious discussion often abases the importance of the topic.
8. She believes that true leadership should uplift, not abases, the team members.
9. The policy change abases the efforts of those who have worked hard for equality.
10. When he belittles others, it only abases his own character in the eyes of his peers.
