

ABDUCE

Meaning: To draw out or evoke something, such as evidence or an emotion, from a situation or audience.

1. The detective was careful not to abduce any evidence during the investigation.
2. In her speech, she sought to abduce compassion from her audience for the plight of refugees.
3. The scientist aimed to abduce the underlying principles of quantum mechanics through his research.
4. He tried to abduce the main idea from the complex text, but found it challenging.
5. To abduce the truth from conflicting testimonies is often the hardest part of a trial.
6. The artist's work seemed to abduce emotions that were deeply buried within the viewer.
7. During the debate, she managed to abduce support for her argument with compelling evidence.
