Meaning: To deviate from the expected or normal course or behavior.

1. The study aimed to identify factors that might aberrate the results of the experiment.
2. His unusual behavior seemed to aberrate from his usual calm demeanor.
3. Some scientists believe that environmental changes can aberrate the natural evolution of species.
4. The author's latest novel took a turn that appeared to aberrate from the themes of his previous works.
