

ABROGATOR

Meaning: ABROGATOR: a person or thing that formally repeals or nullifies a law, rule, or policy.

1. The lawyer argued that the new law served as an abrogator of the previous legislation.
2. In the debate, she passionately defended the bill as an abrogator of outdated policies.
3. The committee viewed the proposed amendment as a potential abrogator of citizens' rights.
