

ABSCIND

Meaning: Abscind (verb): to remove or take away something, especially to eliminate or separate it from a larger context.

1. The detective had to abscond the evidence from the crime scene to avoid contamination.
2. In order to protect his privacy, he decided to abscond his personal information from the public records.
3. During the debate, she chose to abscond her previous statement about the policy changes.
