

ACQUIST

Meaning: Acquiesce: to accept or agree to something passively or without protest.

1. The company plans to acquiesce to the demands of its employees to maintain harmony.
2. In recent negotiations, the union was willing to acquiesce to a smaller wage increase than initially requested.
3. She chose to acquiesce rather than engage in a lengthy debate about the issue.
4. After much discussion, they decided to acquiesce to the proposal for the new project.
5. His reluctance to acquiesce left the team feeling frustrated and divided.
