

ADEEM

Meaning: Adeem refers to the situation in which a specific bequest in a will cannot be fulfilled because the property has been removed from the estate or is no longer available.

1. The legal term 'adeem' refers to property that has been removed from a trust or estate.
2. In the context of inheritance, an adeem occurs when a beneficiary cannot receive a specific bequest because the item is no longer available.
3. If a gift is adeemed, the beneficiary may receive nothing or a different asset instead.
