

ADJOURN

Meaning: To suspend or end a meeting or session, typically with the intention of resuming it later.

1. The committee decided to adjourn the meeting until next week.
 2. After a long debate, the judge chose to adjourn the court session early.
 3. We will adjourn this conference after the final speaker presents.
 4. The school board voted to adjourn their discussions until further notice.
 5. Due to the unexpected storm, they had to adjourn the outdoor event.
 6. Let us adjourn for lunch and reconvene in an hour.
 7. After reviewing all the evidence, the panel agreed to adjourn the investigation.
 8. The meeting was adjourned without reaching a consensus on the proposal.
 9. She suggested we adjourn the conversation until we have more information.
 10. They decided to adjourn the rally in light of the new safety measures.
 11. The meeting was adjourned until next week to allow everyone time to gather more information.
