

AFFRICATE

Meaning: An affricate is a consonant sound that starts as a complete closure (stop) and is released with a turbulent airflow (fricative).

1. An affricate is a consonant that begins as a stop and releases as a fricative.
2. In English, the sounds /tʃ/ as in "chair" and /dʒ/ as in "judge" are examples of affricates.
3. Linguists often study affricates to understand their role in different languages.
4. The affricate phonemes can vary significantly from one language to another.
5. She noticed that the affricate in his speech was pronounced more clearly than in hers.
6. Affricates are less common than simple stops and fricatives in many languages.
7. In phonetics, an affricate is represented by a combination of two symbols.
