Meaning: Exaggeration: a statement that represents something as greater or more intense than it actually is, often for emphasis or comedic effect.

1. Her description of the event was such an exaggeration that it became hard to believe any part of it.

3. He tends to make an exaggeration out of every minor incident, often leaving his friends amused.
