

AMERCE

Meaning: To amerce means to impose a penalty or fine on someone, typically as a form of punishment for an offense or violation.

1. The judge decided to amerce the company for their repeated violations of safety regulations.
2. In an effort to discourage littering, the city council voted to amerce offenders with hefty fines.
3. The wealthy businessman was amerced for his role in the environmental disaster.
4. During the trial, the defendant was amerced for contempt of court after disrupting proceedings.
5. Authorities may amerce individuals who fail to comply with public health guidelines.
6. After reviewing the evidence, the committee chose to amerce the organization for unethical practices.
7. The school board proposed to amerce students who consistently arrived late to class.
8. To maintain order, the event organizers decided to amerce anyone who engaged in disruptive behavior.
9. The local government has the power to amerce property owners who neglect to maintain their lawns.
10. Failure to pay the required fees could result in being amerced by the municipality.
