

ANTIPHHRASIS

Meaning: Antiphrasis is a rhetorical device in which a word or phrase is used in a way that conveys a meaning opposite to its literal sense, often for ironic or sarcastic effect.

1. Antiphrasis is often used in irony to convey a meaning opposite to the literal interpretation.
2. In her sarcastic tone, she referred to the messy room as her "tidy little sanctuary."
3. The politician's claim of transparency was an example of antiphrasis, given the numerous scandals.
