*Meaning: An appositive is a noun or noun phrase that renames or clarifies another noun it is placed next to in a sentence.*

1. The term 'appositive' refers to a noun or noun phrase that renames another noun right beside it.
2. In the sentence "My brother, a talented musician, plays the guitar," the phrase "a talented musician" is an appositive.
3. He visited Paris, the capital of France, during his summer vacation.
4. The author, a well-known historian, published a new book last year.
5. Her dog, a fluffy golden retriever, loves to play fetch in the park.
6. The movie, a thrilling adventure, kept the audience on the edge of their seats.
7. The teacher, Mrs. Johnson, is known for her engaging lessons.
8. We found the old book, a rare first edition, in the dusty attic.
9. His favorite snack, peanut butter and jelly sandwiches, is a childhood classic.
10. The city of Rome, a place rich in history, attracts millions of tourists each year.
