Meaning: To befog means to obscure or confuse, often by creating a haze or indistinctness in perception or clarity.

1. The artist's work seemed to befog the lines between reality and imagination.
2. As the morning sun rose, a thick mist began to befog the landscape.
3. The mystery novel was so intricate that it could befog even the most astute readers.
4. Her sudden departure began to befog our understanding of the situation.
5. The fog from the river would often befog the view of the distant hills.
