7. The artist begirded the canvas with a bold stroke of paint.
8. In preparation for the ceremony, they begirded the altar with fresh flowers.
9. The warrior begirded his sword tightly, ready for the challenge ahead.
10. The team begirded their strategy with careful analysis and planning.
