Meaning: 'Beleave' is a nonstandard variation of 'believe,' meaning to accept something as true or to have faith in something, often used informally or in dialect.

1. I can't beleave how quickly time flies when you're having fun.
2. She tried to beleave in the impossible, despite all evidence to the contrary.
3. It's hard to beleave that such a small change could make a big difference.
4. I want to beleave that everything will work out in the end.
5. He struggled to beleave the story she told about her childhood.
6. Many people find it difficult to beleave in themselves when facing challenges.
7. They wanted to beleave in the magic of the moment, despite their doubts.
8. I can barely beleave my eyes when I see the beautiful scenery here.
9. It's easier to beleave in a happy ending than to confront harsh realities.
10. She encouraged him to beleave in his dreams and pursue them relentlessly.
