Meaning: To bemean means to belittle or degrade someone or something, often to enhance one's own status or self-esteem.

1. It is unkind to bemean others to elevate oneself.
2. She felt that his comments were meant to bemean her achievements.
3. The comedian's jokes often bemean social norms in a humorous way.
4. He realized that trying to bemean his rival only made him look insecure.
