

CATECHIZE

Meaning: To catechize means to instruct or question someone in a systematic way, often about religious beliefs or principles, to ensure understanding.

1. The priest decided to catechize the youth group before their confirmation.
2. Teachers often catechize their students to ensure they understand the material.
3. During the retreat, the leaders took time to catechize the participants on the importance of faith.
4. Parents are encouraged to catechize their children about moral values and ethics.
5. The church hosts weekly sessions to catechize newcomers in the community.
6. She spent hours preparing to catechize her students effectively on the topic of compassion.
7. He felt called to catechize others about the teachings of his faith.
8. The catechism class aims to catechize individuals of all ages in the fundamentals of belief.
