

CHASTISE

Meaning: To chastise means to scold or reprimand someone for their behavior or actions.

1. The teacher had to chastise the student for repeatedly talking during the lecture.
2. After realizing his mistake, he feared that his parents would chastise him for misplacing the car keys.
3. The coach did not hesitate to chastise the players for their lack of effort during the game.
4. In her novel, the protagonist often chastises herself for not making better choices.
5. He was careful not to chastise his friend too harshly, knowing they were going through a tough time.
6. The manager decided to chastise the team privately rather than in front of the entire office.
7. Parents sometimes feel the need to chastise their children to instill discipline and responsibility.
8. Chastising someone in public can lead to embarrassment and resentment rather than constructive change.
9. The critic did not mince words when he chose to chastise the filmmaker for his uninspired script.
10. She felt it was her duty to chastise her colleagues when they ignored the established protocols.
