

CHIROGRAPH

Meaning: Chirograph: a written document or deed, especially one that is signed and sealed, serving as a formal record of an agreement or grant.

1. The ancient chirograph, signed and sealed by the king, granted the lands to the monastery in perpetuity.
2. Historians discovered a fragile chirograph in the archives, detailing the terms of the 14th-century trade agreement.

10. The term "chirograph" derives from the Greek words for "hand" and "writing," emphasizing its handwritten nature.
