

CIRCUMLOCUTION

Meaning: Circumlocution is the use of unnecessarily lengthy or indirect language to express an idea, often leading to confusion or ambiguity.

1. His tendency towards circumlocution made even the simplest instructions feel overly complicated.
2. The politician's circumlocution during the debate left many voters confused about his actual stance on the issues.
3. In her speech, she avoided direct answers, opting instead for circumlocution that frustrated the audience.
