

CO-MEDDLE

Meaning: Co-meddle: to interfere or involve oneself in the affairs of others, often in a way that is unwelcome or intrusive.

1. It's best not to co-meddle in other people's personal affairs, as it can create unnecessary tension.
2. The community decided to co-meddle in the school board's decisions, advocating for more transparency.
3. When friends co-meddle in each other's relationships, it often leads to misunderstandings and hurt feelings.
4. They had no intention to co-meddle, but their advice was often taken as interference.
5. In her desire to help, she sometimes would co-meddle, not realizing the boundaries that should be respected.
