

COCKBILL

Meaning: Cockbill: to tilt or raise (a ship's bow or sails) at an angle, often in preparation for changing conditions such as a storm.

1. The ship's sails were adjusted to cockbill in preparation for the storm.
2. As the fisherman prepared to haul in his net, he noticed the boat had begun to cockbill.
3. During the regatta, the crew had to cockbill the main sail to catch the wind more effectively.
4. To navigate the shallow waters, they had to cockbill the vessel and raise the anchor.
5. The captain instructed the crew to cockbill the bow of the ship to avoid grounding on the sandbank.
