Meaning: To coerce means to compel someone to act or decide in a certain way through force, intimidation, or undue pressure.

1. The detective refused to coerce a confession from the suspect, believing in the importance of ethical practices.
2. She felt it was wrong to coerce her friend into making a decision that he wasn't comfortable with.
3. In an attempt to coerce the team into meeting the deadline, the manager resorted to threats and intimidation.
4. The government should not coerce its citizens into compliance through fear or manipulation.
5. He realized that trying to coerce someone to change their beliefs often only deepened their resolve.
