

COMMENDAM

Meaning: Commendam: a temporary assignment or authority granted to an individual, typically in a religious context, to oversee a vacant position or parish.

1. The bishop granted the priest a commendam to oversee the vacant parish.
2. In the absence of a permanent appointment, the church council decided to issue a commendam to a trusted deacon.
3. She received a commendam for her diligent work in managing the church's outreach programs.
4. The commendam allowed him to maintain his salary while serving in a different capacity.
5. After the retirement of the previous rector, a commendam was necessary to ensure continuity in leadership.
