Meaning: Commination: a formal denunciation or threat of punishment, often expressed in a warning or admonition.

1. The commination issued by the judge left the defendant visibly shaken.
2. In the context of the debate, the senator's commination against corruption was particularly powerful.
3. Many religious texts contain a commination that warns followers of the consequences of sin.
4. The commination against the negligent party was a turning point in the legal proceedings.
