

COMMINATORY

Meaning: Comminatory: serving to warn or threaten, especially regarding consequences or penalties.

1. The comminatory nature of the warning left no doubt about the consequences of ignoring it.
2. In her speech, she made a comminatory reference to the penalties for noncompliance with the new regulations.
3. The judge issued a comminatory admonition to the defendant before delivering his final verdict.
4. His comminatory tone suggested that failure to act would lead to severe repercussions.
5. The company's policy includes a comminatory clause aimed at deterring unethical behavior among employees.

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
