

CONDESCEND

Meaning: To condescend means to speak or behave towards someone in a way that shows a belief in one's superiority, often treating them as if they are less intelligent or capable.

1. She spoke to him in a condescending tone, as if he were incapable of understanding her point.
2. Despite her achievements, she often condescended to her colleagues, undermining their confidence.
3. It's frustrating when people condescend to you simply because of your age or experience.
4. He tried not to condescend, but his privileged background made it difficult to relate to others.
5. Her condescending attitude alienated many of her friends, leaving her feeling isolated.

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
