

CONDITORY

Meaning: Conditory (adjective): relating to an obligation or clause in a contract that is dependent on the occurrence of a future event.

1. The contract included a conditory clause that specified the obligations of both parties.
2. In legal terms, a conditory obligation is one that is dependent on a future event.
3. The judge ruled that the conditory nature of the agreement made it unenforceable.
4. She understood that her inheritance was conditory upon her completing the requirements set forth in the will.
5. The team's success was conditory on their ability to work together effectively under pressure.

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
