Meaning: To confer means to discuss or exchange ideas on a particular topic, often to make a decision or seek advice.

3. She plans to confer her findings at the upcoming international conference on climate change.
4. In order to make a well-informed decision, the board members chose to confer with each other privately.

7. To confer with your colleagues before making a decision is always a wise approach.
