Meaning: To confound means to confuse or bewilder someone, often by presenting something unexpected or difficult to understand.

1. The unexpected twist in the plot served to confound the audience, leaving them in stunned silence.
2. Her ability to solve complex problems seemed to confound even the most experienced mathematicians.
3. The sudden change in weather patterns confounded the researchers, who had predicted a stable climate.
4. Despite his attempts to clarify the issue, his explanations only seemed to confound his colleagues further.
5. The magician's tricks were designed to confound the spectators, making them question their own perceptions.
