

CONSONANT

Meaning: A consonant is a speech sound produced by obstructing airflow in the vocal tract, represented by letters in the alphabet that are not vowels.

1. A consonant is a speech sound that is not a vowel.
2. In English, the letters B, C, D, F, G, and H are all examples of consonants.
3. When learning to read, children often focus on recognizing consonant sounds first.
