

CONSUBSTANTIATION

Meaning: Consubstantiation is the theological belief that, during communion, the body and blood of Christ coexist with the bread and wine, rather than being transformed into them.

1. The theological debate centered around the concept of consubstantiation and its implications for the nature of the Eucharist.
2. In his lecture, the professor explained consubstantiation as the belief that Christ's body and blood coexist with the bread and wine during communion.
