

CONTORT

Meaning: To twist or bend out of shape, often in a way that is unnatural or painful.

1. The dancer's body seemed to contort gracefully as she moved across the stage.
2. In pain, he could feel his muscles contort, making it difficult to stand.
3. The artist used shadows to create an illusion that the sculpture was about to contort.
4. As the storm raged outside, the trees began to contort under the force of the wind.
5. He watched in fascination as the magician made the rope contort into impossible shapes.
