

# CULPATORY

*Meaning: Culpatory refers to evidence or statements that imply or indicate guilt or blame.*

1. The evidence presented was far from conclusive, leaving the jury with no culpatory proof against the defendant.
2. In her statement, she expressed regret but maintained that her actions were not culpatory.
3. The prosecutor's argument was filled with emotional appeals, yet it lacked any culpatory facts that could truly incriminate the suspect.
