Meaning: Debarrass (verb): To officially exclude or prohibit someone from participating in a group or activity, often due to violations or misconduct.

1. The committee decided to debar the member who had violated the rules.
2. Efforts to debar the corrupt official were met with significant resistance.
3. She worked tirelessly to debar any harmful influences from her life.
4. The school administration aimed to debar students from participating in the event without proper permission.
5. His actions were so egregious that the board felt compelled to debar him from future meetings.
