Meaning: Deflective: serving to cause something to change direction or to divert attention away from a specific issue.

1. The engineer designed a deflective barrier to redirect the flow of water away from the building's foundation.
2. Her deflective remarks during the meeting made it clear that she was unwilling to address the issue directly.
3. The artist used deflective techniques in the sculpture to create an illusion of movement and depth.
4. In physics, a deflective surface can change the trajectory of an object, allowing for more controlled experiments.
5. The coach emphasized the importance of deflective strategies in order to counter the opponent's aggressive plays.
