

DENTATE-CILIATE

Meaning: Dentate-ciliate refers to a leaf or frond margin that has both tooth-like (dentate) projections and fine, hair-like (ciliate) structures, contributing to the identification and adaptability of certain plant and organism species.

1. The dentate-ciliate structure of the leaf margins is a distinguishing feature in several plant species.
2. Researchers observed that the dentate-ciliate edges of the organism's fronds increased its adaptability to varying aquatic environments.
3. In botany, the term dentate-ciliate refers to leaves that possess both serrated and hair-like projections along their edges.
4. The dentate-ciliate appearance of the petals added to the overall texture and visual appeal of the flower.
5. During the microscopic analysis, the dentate-ciliate characteristics of the algae were highlighted as vital for its identification.

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
