

# DENTIROSTRATE

*Meaning: DENTIROSTRATE: adjective describing a bird's bill that is pointed and adapted for extracting insects from narrow spaces, such as crevices in bark.*

1. The dentirostrate bill of the bird allows it to extract insects from crevices in the bark.
2. Ornithologists often study dentirostrate species to understand their feeding adaptations and ecological roles.
3. The dentirostrate shape of the beak is particularly suited for probing flowers for nectar.
4. In a diverse ecosystem, dentirostrate birds can coexist with other species that have different feeding mechanisms.
5. During the field trip, we observed several dentirostrate birds skillfully foraging along the riverbank.
