

# DILATE

*Meaning: To dilate means to become wider or larger, often in response to external stimuli such as light or temperature.*

1. The doctor explained how the pupils dilate in response to low light conditions.
2. As the temperature increased, the metal began to dilate and expand.
3. During exercise, the blood vessels dilate to allow more oxygen to reach the muscles.
4. She watched as the flowers would dilate in the warmth of the sun each morning.

13. When the heart rate increases, blood vessels dilate to allow for better circulation.
14. During childbirth, the cervix must dilate sufficiently to allow for the passage of the baby.
15. In certain medical conditions, the body may dilate blood vessels as a way to regulate temperature.
