

DIMORPH

Meaning: Dimorph (verb): to exhibit two distinct forms or variations, particularly in response to environmental factors or conditions.

1. The researchers were excited to observe how the species could dimorph in response to environmental changes.
2. In the wild, the butterfly's wings can dimorph to display different colors depending on the time of day.
3. When breeding the fish in captivity, the scientists noted that they would often dimorph under specific light conditions.
4. The ability of certain plants to dimorph based on soil type adds to their adaptability and survival.
5. Studying how these animals dimorph has provided new insights into evolutionary biology.
