Meaning: DISAFFECT: to cause someone to lose affection or loyalty; to alienate or disenchant.

1. The government's recent policies have begun to disaffect a significant portion of the population.
2. Her harsh criticism of the team's performance threatened to disaffect the players' motivation.
3. To avoid disaffecting the community, the organization held multiple public forums for discussion.
4. The CEO's lack of transparency may disaffect employees, leading to lower morale in the workplace.
