Meaning: To disaffirm means to declare a contract or agreement invalid or void, typically due to a lack of consent or other legal grounds.

1. The court decided to disaffirm the previous contract due to the lack of consent.
2. He chose to disaffirm his acceptance of the agreement after discovering the hidden fees.
3. The decision to disaffirm the policy was made after careful consideration of the terms.
4. In some cases, minors are allowed to disaffirm contracts to protect their interests.
