

DISBRANCH

Meaning: To disbranch means to remove or cut off branches from a plant or tree.

1. The gardener decided to disbranch the overgrown shrubs to encourage healthier growth.
2. As the storm approached, the strong winds threatened to disbranch several trees in the park.
3. In an effort to reshape the plant, she carefully disbranched the lower limbs to promote a more upright structure.
4. The old apple tree needed attention, so he opted to disbranch some of the thicker branches that were blocking sunlight.
5. To improve airflow through the dense foliage, the landscaper recommended to disbranch the bushes strategically.
