

# DISCRADLE

*Meaning: Discradle (verb): To carefully remove or take apart something that is supported or held in place, often to facilitate inspection or repair.*

1. The engineer had to discradle the complex mechanism before making any repairs.
2. She carefully discradled the fragile sculpture from its display case.
3. In order to transport the antique furniture safely, we decided to discradle it from its original base.
4. The technician instructed us to discradle the device to access the internal components.
5. After the storm, we had to discradle the fallen branches from the power lines.
