

DISHABITUATE

Meaning: Dishabituate: to restore a response to a stimulus after it has been diminished or extinguished due to repeated exposure.

1. The researchers aimed to dishabituate the subjects from the repeated stimuli in order to observe their reactions to new stimuli.
2. After several weeks of exposure, the therapist worked to dishabituate the patient from the anxiety-triggering environment.
3. To dishabituate the animals, the team introduced a novel object to their familiar surroundings.
4. In her latest study, she sought methods to dishabituate participants who had become desensitized to the advertising campaign.
5. The goal of the training session was to dishabituate the dogs from the loud noises that had previously frightened them.
