

DISJUNCTURE

Meaning: Disjuncture refers to a lack of connection or a significant difference between two or more elements, often leading to conflict or inconsistency.

1. The disjuncture between the two political parties has created significant polarization in public opinion.
2. During the discussion, she highlighted the disjuncture between theory and practice in the education system.
3. There was a noticeable disjuncture in his argument that left the audience confused and seeking clarification.
