

DISMARSHAL

Meaning: DISMARSHAL: to reorganize or disperse a group or resources, typically in a military context, to clarify roles or redistribute supplies.

1. The captain decided to dismarshal the troops to ensure everyone understood their roles.
2. After the chaotic retreat, the general ordered his officers to dismarshal the remaining supplies.
3. In the face of uncertainty, he chose to dismarshal his emotions and focus on the task at hand.
4. The project manager had to dismarshal the team to clarify the project's objectives and deadlines.
5. During the meeting, she would often dismarshal her thoughts before presenting them to the group.
