Meaning: To disown means to refuse to acknowledge or maintain a relationship with someone or something, often due to shame or disapproval.

1. After the scandal, the politician chose to disown any association with the controversial group.
2. She felt that her actions were so unforgivable that her family might disown her forever.
3. In his will, he explicitly stated that he would disown anyone who attempted to contest it.
4. The father decided to disown his son after learning about his criminal activities.
5. Feeling betrayed, she wished she could disown the toxic friendships that had held her back.
